A person could look down the street and see neon signs advertising beer and bars and a sea of white hats bobbing up and down as sailors made their way from bar to bar. Hi Ralph,

I'm Rick Campbell, a submarine officer who retired last year after thirty-two years in the Navy. As I approached retirement, I decided to try my hand at writing novels and ended up with a book deal with Macmillan / St. Martin's Press, one of the biggest publishers in the country.

My first book, a submarine thriller titled *The Trident Deception*, is getting fantastic reviews. Booklist has even hailed it as – **the best submarine novel written in the last 30 years – since Tom Clancy's classic The Hunt For Red October!** (I've pasted the early reviews below.) My publisher is very excited about the book and is heavily promoting it, and the book will be featured at the front of all Barnes & Nobles nationwide for two weeks. However, over 1000 novels are published each week, and my publisher can keep me at the front of bookstores for only so long before it's swept into oblivion by the tidal wave of new books.

I've got a short window for my book to become a success. If the book doesn't catch on, publishers these days won't give you a second chance – they'll toss you aside and look for the next hot thing. The book is getting great reviews, but that'll amount to a hill's worth of beans if not enough people hear about the book. My publisher is doing everything they can via traditional means, and I'm doing my best to help, reaching

out to those I think would enjoy reading it.

I think former Haddo crew members are the perfect audience and would enjoy reading *The Trident Deception*. I was wondering if it were possible for you to forward this email to former crew members. I'd really appreciate it!

As I mentioned, my publisher is very excited about the book and is sinking a ton of money promoting it at Barnes & Noble, and will also be advertising on Fox News (computer, tablet, and mobile) starting March 11th, totaling 2.3 million impressions (ads). However, with that kind of investment, word on the street is - if my book doesn't do well, St. Martin's is going to torture and dismember me.

(Just kidding! Maybe. I'm not exactly sure...)

So that's my pitch. Can you help me? I've put a ton of work into writing the book, finding an agent, getting a book deal, and now I've got a narrow window to turn my dream of becoming a successful writer into a reality (and keep my arms and legs). I would really appreciate it if you would spread the word about a great combination espionage/submarine thriller that's getting fantastic reviews to former Haddo crew members.

9:00 AM The H.L. Hunley and The Cold War Memorial

On February 17, 1864 the Confederate Submarine, H. L. Hunley successfully sank the Union warship, the Housatonic in Charleston Harbor by ramming it. After this successful foray she also sank with all of her crew to the bottom of the Atlantic where she remained until August 8, 2000. On this auspicious day after months of planning and work by archeologists from the state and National Park Service, divers and marine engineers, she was successfully raised and taken to a special tank at the Warren Lasch Conservation Center in North Charleston. Today we will have the opportunity to view this 19th century marvel as the archeologists continue their research and stabilize the boat. After our visit to the Hunley we will continue on to Patriots Point where you will have the opportunity to look at the COLD WAR MEMORIAL and view the benches in honor of those we served aboard the USS Haddo and her sister ship the USS Pollack.
